
New Study – Genesis

All the messages follow a curriculum and a few weeks ago we started a new series focusing on the Book of Acts.

During this time we have learned that the book of Acts is the sequel to the gospel of Luke with both books written by the Apostle Luke. The Gospel of Luke chronicles the birth, ministry, miracles, betrayal, trial, crucifixion, resurrection and ascension of Jesus Christ. Thus, the gospel of Luke details the time Jesus walked the earth.

The book of Acts does a quick review of the ascension and then chronicles the "actions of the apostles" following the ascension. In other words, Acts records the happenings after Jesus left this earth.

By way of these weekly studies we have examined how the apostles waited on the gift of the Holy Spirit to descend upon them just as Jesus foretold. And with the arrival of the Holy Spirit you read about the transition of Peter, from the curt, brash apostle to the preacher at Pentecost and as a new Peter, the leader. Acts also details the birth of the church and just how important that was to the early believers, and it's just as important for us today. Be sure to tune in weekly for a message examining the Acts of the Holy Spirit.

"Tuning in" to acts of service gives me a chance to give a "shout out" to two of our Youth for heading up a "Welcome Basket" surprise for our newly promoted sixth grade students. **Kaysie Goff** and **Chloe Lynn Collins** realized that with our covid restrictions we couldn't welcome the "newbies" in our traditional manner. Thus they purchased items to create a nice welcome basket and then with COVID precautions delivered each basket to our new students. Great job ladies!! That is a great example of acts for Him.
