Burnt Offering	Lev. 1:1-17; 6:8-13	The entire animal, except the skin, was burned on the altar	Sprinkled around the altar	The priests received the skin	Christ's complete sacrifice
Meal Offering	Lev. 2:1-16; 6:14-18	Fine flour or cakes made from the flour; a handful was burned on the altar	None	All but a handful was given to the priests	Christ's sinlessness typified in the lack of leaven
Peace Offering	Lev. 3:1-17; 7:11-21, 28-34; 19:5-8	The animal's fat was burned; the one bringing the offering ate some of the meat	Sprinkled around and on the altar	Breast, shoulder, and leavened bread were to be eaten by the priests	Christ's sacrifice grants believers peace with God
Sin Offering	Lev. 4:1-35; 6:24-30	Sin of a priest or the entire congregation: The animal's fat was burned on the altar, the rest of the animal was burned outside the camp	Taken inside the Holy Place, sprinkled 7 times toward the veil and smeared on the horns of the altar of incense; the rest was poured out at the base of the altar of burnt offering	The priests received nothing	Christ, the perfect and final sin offering, bore our sin on the cross
		Sin of a ruler or common person: All the fat burned on the altar	Smeared on the horns of the altar of burnt offering; the rest was poured out at the base of that altar	The priests ate the meat	
Trespass Offering	Lev. 5:1 – 6:7; 7:1-10	Animal sacrifice, grain offering, and restitution; fat and handful of grain burned on the altar	Sprinkled around the altar	The priests received the skin, all the males of the priestly families ate the meat and cakes made from the grain	Christ has forgiven all our trespasses
